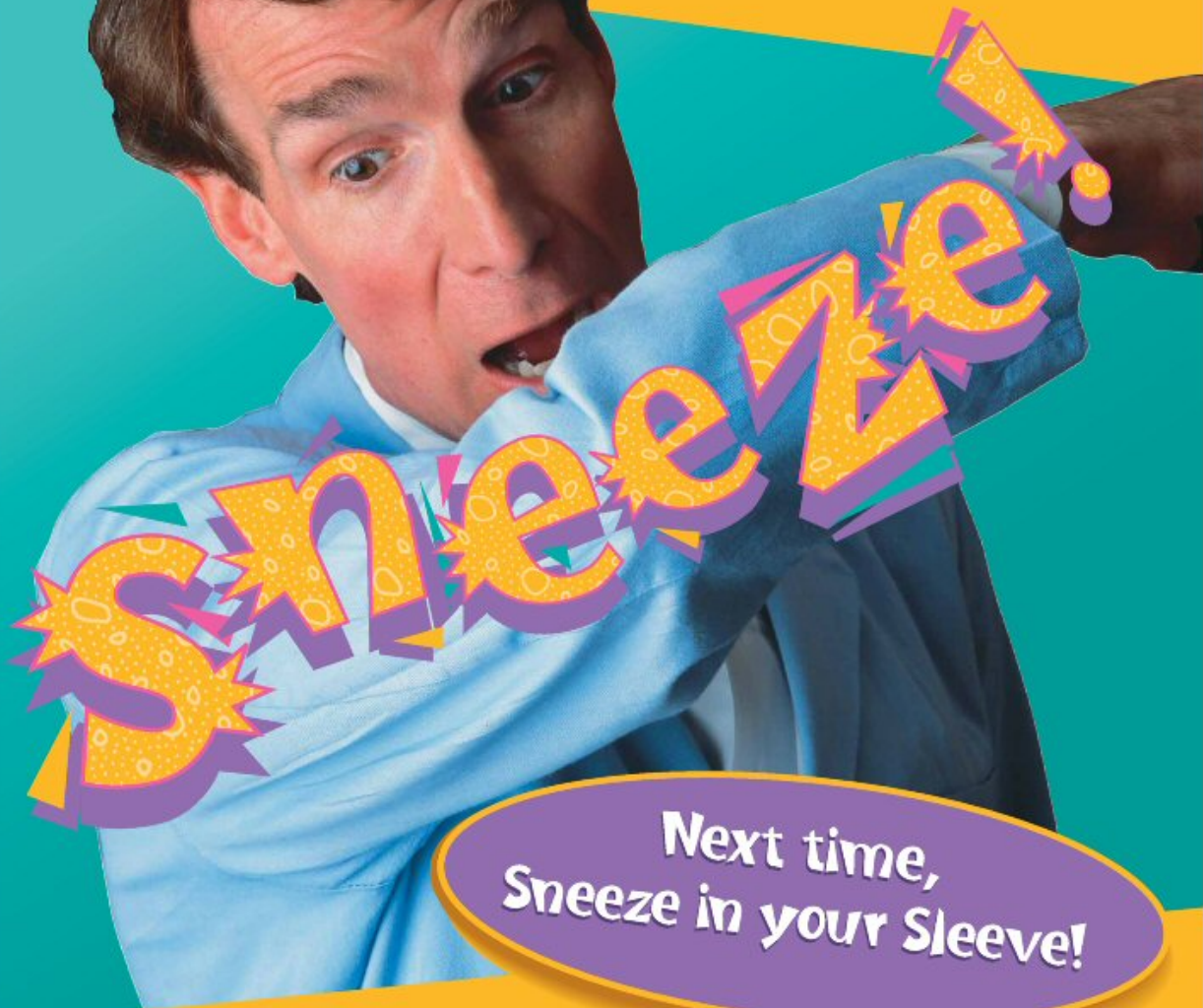


**Germs fly up to 100 miles
